Talk about ways that the real cookies are like the truth and the printed cookies are like telling a lie. A few suggestions are below.

- The paper cookies look good to eat, but are not. Lies might look good, but they are not.
- The paper cookies won't fool anyone for long. Lies might fool someone for a short time, but usually will be found out.
- No one wanted to take a printed cookie. No one wants to be lied to, that is why we should tell the truth.

As you enjoy the cookies together, remind your children that we should always tell the truth. Just like getting a plate full of paper cookies would be a big disappointment, telling lies to others will be a big disappointment to them and to God. That is why it is important to always tell the truth.
