Lesson #4 FAITHFULNESS

The purpose of this lesson plan is to:

- · Create a fun and interactive learning experience
- Provide teaching options in addition to the Leader Q Card
- Creatively revisit the Bible story featured in the teaching video
- · Give kids an opportunity to further explore the application point

PROGRAM

Activity	Length of Segment	Running Time
Q Card: Discussion	15 minutes	Start-15 minutes

PREP

You will need:

- Large Group Only: 16 small bags of fruit snacks for each group
- Small Groups only: 8 small bags of fruit snacks for each group
- Game Prizes (fruit snacks optional)
- Story Props (optional)
- Prayer Cards (1 per kid)
- MAP Books (1 per kid)

PICTURE

(The Bible Story)

In this portion of your class time you have the opportunity to retell the Bible story presented earlier in the teaching video. The object is to paint a picture that kids will understand and remember. When telling the story, remember you are painting a picture for your viewers. Have fun and explore your creativity. Here are some ideas to make your storytelling more memorable:

- Try using props as you tell the story- A tree or plant, scissors, real figs
- Give the kids a real fig to eat at the end of the story

The Fig Tree Luke 13:6-9

Then Jesus used this illustration, "A man planted a fig tree in his garden and came again and again to see if there was any fruit on it, but he was always disappointed. Finally he said to the gardener, 'I've waited three years, and there hasn't been a single fig. Cut it down. It's taking up space we can use for something else.' The gardener answered, 'Give it one more chance. Leave it another year and I will give it

special attention and plenty of fertilizer. If we get figs next year, fine. If not, you can cut it down."

PLAY

(Learning Activity)

In this portion of your class time you will lead your class in a fun and exciting activity that will help your kids apply the Bible lesson to their everyday lives.

"Fun with Faithful Fruit"

HOW TO START:

- Large Group Only: Divide kids into 4 teams
- Small Group Only: Divide kids into 2 teams

HOW TO PLAY:

- Say, "This game is called Fun with Faithful Fruit. This game will help us to remember that faithfulness is a fruit of the Spirit."
- Begin round #1. Team #1 rolls the dice.
- Team #1 answers the round #1 question and earns the number of points equal to the roll of the dice.
- · Each of the remaining teams then takes one turn each.
- To finish round #1, one player from each team competes in the Faithful Fruit Bonus Round.
- Give one bag of fruit snacks to each player.
- Say, "GO!" Players eat the fruit snacks.
- The first player to finish the fruit snacks earns 10 points for his/her team.
- Begin round #2.
- Repeat all steps for the remaining 3 rounds.

GAME QUESTIONS:

- Round #1 Question (same question for each team)
 How can you show faithfulness at home?
- Round #2 Question (same question for each team)
 How can you show faithfulness at school?
- Round #3 Question (same question for each team)
 How can you be a faithful friend?
- Round #4 Question (same question for each team)
 What is one way you can be faithful to God?

PLAY OPTIONS:

 Younger kids: use a smaller number of fruit snacks for eating contest Hand out game prizes (fruit snacks - optional)

PLAN

(Group Commitment)

In this portion of your class time you have the opportunity to lead your group to make a commitment. You may select any ONE of the options provided or your group may create its' own. Encourage the kids to write their commitments on their Prayer Cards so you can be praying for them during the week.

Commitment Options:

- Do one thing each day to show faithfulness at home this week.
- Do one thing each day to be a faithful friend, brother, or sister this week.
- Do one thing each day to show faithfulness to God this week.

PRAYER

In this portion of your class time, have your kids fill out the Prayer Card. Take the cards home and pray for your kids throughout the week. End your time together by praying for your group commitment.

Hand out prayer cards


- Ask Kids to fill in their commitments in the space provided
- Ask kids to fill in their prayer requests in the space provided
- Collect cards so you can take them home and pray for your kids
- · Close in prayer

Distraction can keep us from doing what is important. Distraction can keep us from reading our Bible and praying. Distraction can keep us from growing in our relationship with God.

LIVE IT

Being faithful means, when you know what to do you follow through. As you complete each day's tasks pray, "God, help me to be an example of your faithfulness in ever area of my life."

"Before they ask, complete the task!"
